WEDNESDAY 14 – MASS 12NOON ASH WEDNESDAY As we observe the gradual lengthening of days, signalling the approach of spring, we are reminded of the significant religious observances that accompany this season of renewal. In the Christian calendar, the period leading up to Easter holds deep spiritual meaning, beginning with Shrove Tuesday

Ash Wednesday, this year falling on 14 February, marks the commencement of Lent. It is a day steeped in centuries of tradition, serving as a collective moment of penance for the

entire Church of the Roman Rite. On this solemn day, we embrace the practices of fasting and abstaining from meat as expressions of our faith and penitence.

In keeping with liturgical norms, the Penitential Act is customarily omitted at the start of the Mass on Ash Wednesday. Following the Gospel reading, there is the blessing and distribution of ashes, as outlined in the Roman Missal (RM. 234-235). These ashes, symbolizing our human mortality and penitence, serve as a physical reminder of our journey towards spiritual renewal.

I warmly invite each of you to join me at Holy Mass and receive the ashes, as we embark on this Lenten journey together. Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday, 14 February at 12noon in our Parish. Additionally, an earlier Mass is scheduled at 9.30 am at Sacred Heart and St Patrick, Sowerby Bridge. Ashes will be distributed at all Masses.

This Lenten season offers a precious opportunity for reflection, prayer, and renewal of our faith. Let us come together as a community to observe these holy traditions and prepare our hearts for the joyous celebration of Easter.

- 1. Decide a time to **pray** each day. (Get your copy of My Day by Day Lent)
- 2. Choose to **fast** from something you enjoy throughout Lent.
- 3. Think of a way you can give your time to someone else each week of Lent.

MOUNT ST JOSEPH'S CARE HOME UPDATE due to the presence of Reinforced Aerated Autoclaved Concrete (RAAC) the Little Sisters of the Poor have had to make the difficult decision to close the Mount St Joseph's Care Home in Leeds. Over the next few months all 62 residents will be found new homes and more than 90 staff face redundancy. The Little Sisters are facing unexpected costs upwards of £500,000 to keep everyone safe until all residents are re-homed.
