JUBILEE OF 2025 The Bull of Indiction (the formal announcement or proclamation) published by Pope Francis for the Jubilee of 2025 is called Spes non confundit, meaning

'Hope does not disappoint'. In the Bull, Pope Francis proclaims: "Pilgrimage is of course a fundamental element of every Jubilee event. Setting out on a journey is traditionally associated with our human quest for meaning in life.

I hope that in the Holy Year of Jubilee as many people as possible will try to take part in the annual diocesan pilgrimages to Lourdes (4th to 10th July 2025) and Walsingham (27th September 2025), the Batley Torchlight Procession in Honour of Our Lady (6th October 2025), our Walking Pilgrimage for Vocations between Keighley and Ilkley (29th March 2025) and the St Wilfrid's Way Camino from Leeds to Ripon (10th to 11th October 2025). In response to Pope Francis' encouragement to embrace this historic tradition of pilgrimage, and using the provisions given by the Apostolic Penitentiary, the bishop has designated the following churches within the Diocese of Leeds as Jubilee Pilgrimage Churches for the Holy Year:

- 1. Leeds Cathedral Church of St Anne
- 2. St Mary of the Angels Church, Batley
- 3. St Patrick's Mission Church, Bradford
- 4. St Mary's Church, Halifax
- 5. St Patrick's Church, Huddersfield
- 6. St Joseph's Church, Keighley
- 7. St Austin's Church, Wakefield
- 8. St Wilfrid's Church, Ripon + Chapel of Our Lady of the Crag, Knaresborough
- 9. St Stephen's Church, Skipton
- 10. St Edward the Confessor Church, Clifford

The churches have been selected on the basis of their centrality in the respective areas of the diocese, historic resonance and seating capacity. Each Jubilee Pilgrimage Church will host opportunities at advertised times during the Holy Year, to take part in various liturgical celebrations, devotions, and heritage days.

THE NEW ENGLISH LECTIONARY Some years ago the Bishops of England and Wales decided to change the translation being used for the readings at Mass, from the Jerusalem Bible (which has been used for as long as most of us can remember) to something called the English Standard Version, which is yet another descendant of the RSV. Finally, the changeover was made in December 2024. From now on, at Mass in England, Wales and Scotland, the new ESV texts are being used. Universalis contains the new ESV texts for

England, Wales and Scotland. All you need to do is make sure that your local calendar is set to one of these countries and your app is up to date. Sunday Missals are available from the Catholic Truth Society (ISBN 978-1784697990) and Hodder & Stoughton (ISBN 978-1399822770 and 978-1399822831). Visit universalis.com and you'll find a Podcasts button at the top right – well worth your time.

RECYCLING OLD LECTIONARIES At the Bishop's Conference in November 2024, the Bishops agreed that a Guardians of Creation project would be used to dispose and recycle old lectionaries using, in an environmental and sustainable way, as practical. Collect and Recycle have been engaged to facilitate this across all the Dioceses of England and Wales. As we are now using the new lectionaries, arrangements for the disposal of Parish's old lectionaries have been made. To keep costs to a minimum (a Curia expense), the firm engaged have a tight collection window and on how the lectionaries should be collated and boxed for their collection at a single Diocese collection point. I have arranged for the deanery to drop off the lectionaries after Christmas at a Deanery collection point (Sowerby Bridge) by 16 January 2025. Finance Office Colleagues will then collate all the Diocese's old lectionaries at Hinsley Hall as required by the firm for their collection to meet their narrow time frame. In the new year a similar scheme for old Mass Books and other literature that is now also out of date will be implemented.
